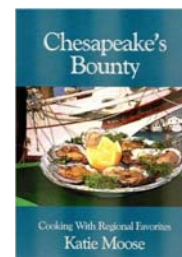
It is important that our count for attendance be as accurate as possible both for our cooks and for table seating.

Our dinner speaker will be Katie Barney Moose. Her presentation is entitled, "Early Chesapeake Food and Herbs." Mrs. Moose was born in Baltimore. She is a descendant of the Clagett family of Maryland and many old New England whaling families.

She has lived in many great architectural, historical and waterside cities in the U.S. besides Annapolis - New Castle, DE; Newport and Providence, RI; Cold Spring Harbor, NY; San Francisco; Philadelphia; Greenwich, CT; Alexandria, VA; Washington, DC; and New York City. Katie presently resides in Easton, MD.

Mrs. Moose is the co-author or author of many books.

Ones that focus on the Chesapeake region include: "Annapolis: The Guidebook," "Eastern Shore of Maryland: The Guidebook," "God's Bounty"; "Chesapeake's Bounty", "Chesapeake's Bounty II, Maryland's Western Shore: The Guidebook." Her hobbies include gourmet cooking, fine wines, history, sailing, genealogy, gardening, theology, and travel.



Hometown Teams: How Sports Shape America

The Galesville Hot Sox is believed to have started in 1915 and was very loosely organized. The baseball team played at the site of the community center before moving to the Wilson Field in 1928.

Over the past year the Galesville Community Center Organization and the community have come together in partnership and commitment to discovering, documenting, preserving, collecting and celebrating Galesville's African American heritage. Oral interviews were conducted, memories captured and artifacts in a documentary story quilt has been created by the community.

The Smithsonian's "Hometown Teams: How Sports Shape America" and the companion exhibit that shares the local story of our own

Hometown Team "Galesville Hot Sox" their history, and the history of Galesville, has been on display since Saturday, July 25, 2015 after a grand opening reception and **ends Saturday, September 12, 2015**. The companion exhibit has focused on Galesville's unique heritage, and the new "Field Guide to Galesville" was unveiled during the opening reception.

How appropriate it is to have the Smithsonian's Exhibit at the Galesville Community Center as we celebrate 100 years of the great legacy of the Galesville Hot Sox Team. It was a century ago when they began playing sandlot baseball.
