Unfortunately, our speaker was unable to attend and at the last minute, Ray Hardesty (long time member of the Galesville Volunteer Fire Dept.) came to the rescue. Many thanks to Ray and Frank Tremel (a former captain of the Galesville Volunteer Fire Department) for their enlightening and educational discussion.

The audience learned how a dedicated group of Galesville residents, at the time of the Great Depression, formed the first volunteer fire company in southern Anne Arundel County. To raise funds to purchase a fire truck, they held many carnivals and on May 9, 1929 the Galesville Volunteer Company was incorporated. The Galesville Volunteer Fire

Department (VFD) was and is an integral part of the village of Galesville. Captivating the audience, Ray and Frank provided interesting and entertaining details of the Galesville Volunteer Fire Department.
