Summer Dinner Meeting, Tuesday, June 14

Please plan to join us for the June dinner meeting. The dinner menu will be: BBQ pork shanks (similar to ribs) and BBQ chicken, roasted red potatoes, vegetable, salad, rolls and dessert.

The dinner speaker is Jeff Beard, a Galesville resident. His presentation is entitled, "Topsides and True Colors: Poster Art of Steam Ships and Ocean Liners."

The age of steam travel by sea lasted for over a century, eclipsed by air travel in terms of ocean-crossing passengers by 1955. The excitement of this era was vividly captured through a new medium of advertising, poster art. Since a few hundred to a few thousand of each image was often

produced, poster art is enjoyable, collectible and somewhat affordable for adorning walls of homes, restaurants and other commercial/institutional buildings.

Among the most dramatic posters were images of steam ships and ocean liners, which along with railroads were the predominant technologies of the day. Jeff Beard, a resident of Galesville, has assembled some of the more striking images in a slide presentation encompassing lithographs from Cunard, Hamburg America, Red Star Line, P&O Lines, French Lines, Canadian Pacific and others. A few of the posters depict inshore steamships



of the Chesapeake Bay, and these images are often more rare than those of the great ship companies. The presentation will also include a brief discussion of values of vintage posters in the current market versus modern scanned and offset printed images on paper (given the strides in digital art, it is sometimes difficult to tell one apart from the other).

Take a few notes during the slides, and the group will vote on its "People's Choice" poster at the conclusion of the showing. If you have any posters you want (unofficially) appraised, bring them along for an "Antiques Roadshow" review and valuation.

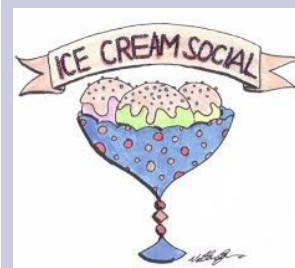
