The speaker will be Mr. Robin Hartge, who will relate the history of the class of sailboats

that became known as the Chesapeake 20s. He will tell us how the boats evolved from the hard chine to the popular round bottom, which was designed by his grandfather Captain Dick Hartge in the mid-1930s. Robin will talk about the friendly sailing rivalries around the Bay – from the Eastern & Western sides and between the West River Boys and the Fairhaven Boys.

Come to the dinner and lecture and discover how the Chesapeake 20s were so

well suited to sail in the fickle winds of the West River and the other tributaries that flow into the Bay.

Central Middle School 7th Graders Study Galesville

On October 22th and 23th, 325 students from Central Middle School visited the village of Galesville. Community groups, including Galesville Heritage Society Museum docents, the County Public Schools, and Anne Arundel County joined forces to host students. They were here to participate in an interactive, immersive history and archaeology experience. This program, developed in coordination with the Galesville Community Center, Anne Arundel **County's Cultural Resources** Division, and the Anne Arundel County Public Schools STEM program, included a day -long field trip, which helped turn 7th graders into real life history detectives.

The students worked alongside professional historians and archaeologists who are conducting archaeological investigations at the County's Hot Sox Field at Wilson Park. Students participated in scientific excavations at the 1870s house site of a former slave Henry Wilson and learned about the heritage and importance of the Hot Sox, a 1920s era "Negro League" sandlot baseball team. Students then fanned out across the village on a "Historic Scavenger Hunt" to locate, learn about, and visit important historic sites and buildings
